Following the successful completion of PR_RS 1 in March 2018, responding to the aftermath of the Hurricanes Irma and Maria, the University of Florida and the Polytechnic University of Puerto Rico are preparing the second edition to be held at the PUPR Campus in San Juan. The PR_RS 2 will address the holistic ideas for intersectoral and interdisciplinary integrative proposals, and open new areas for innovative research and visionary projects under the ambitious goal of a Sustainable and Resilient Puerto Rico for 2045.

The Project of the Future

Background

After the consequential Hurricanes Irma and Maria passage through Puerto Rico and the Caribbean Islands, the Office of Research VP Dr. David Norton opened the possibility of supporting faculty and graduate students from the University of Puerto Rico and Virgin Islands for a limited stay at UF. We were able to receive 3 faculty members and 7 students for 4 weeks in October 2017. The Center for Hydro-generated Urbanism (UF | CHU) acted as the host of the activities and actively engaged in logistics and academics with the UPR visitors. Sponsored by Dean Chimay Anumba from the College of Design, Construction, and Planning (DCP), and Director Jason Alread from the School of Architecture, we developed jointly the ideas for an International Project + Research Workshop, to be held yearly in Puerto Rico. The first edition took place in 2018 from March 16th to 25th. **The Puerto Rico Re_Start PREP**, was the preparatory instance held between October 16th and October 30th 2017, and presented its results publicly on November 1st 2017 at the UF School of Architecture. It produced extensive background data, mappings, bibliographic and web content, alumni linkages, consolidated in a google drive data bank. The damage extent was assessed and documented for key areas and interest focus subjects. The UPR visitors returned to Puerto Rico after the conclusion. Documentation continued to be gathered by both Institutions. **The PR_RS International Project + Research Workshop 1** was held in March 16th-26th 2018, gathering the support of The Chancellor of the University of Puerto Rico, the Dean of Architecture UPR, the UNESCO Chair in Sustainable Urban Quality and Culture Rome, the UF Center for Latin American Studies, the UF International Center, the UF Office of Research, the College of DCP, the School of Architecture, the Shimberg Center, CityLab Orlando, the Center for Puerto Rican Studies, Hunter College, City University in New York, the University of Rome, La Sapienza, the University of Seville, Spain, the New York Institute of Technology, the Politecnico di Torino, the Polytechnic University of Puerto Rico and the University of Turabo. Puerto Rico Re_Start 2 International Project and Research Workshop

The workshop will address the resiliency for the future of the Islands, with expected consequences beyond Puerto Rico, to the Virgin Islands, Guadalupe, Dominica, Barbuda, Haiti and more. Interdisciplinary participants, professionals and academics will gather around subjects of investigation and project proposals. **The international participants, the UNESCO for Sustainable Urban Quality and Urban Culture, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the Polytechnic University of Puerto Rico (PUPR), the University of Puerto Rico (UPR), the Center for Puerto Rican Studies at Hunter College, the Puerto Rico Planning Board, the Center for Latin American Studies, the Office of Research and the International Center at UF, together with Puerto Rico' scholars, and stakeholders will work on the coordination of the comprehensive long-term research agenda, where topics related to a wide selection of issues will be addressed, and long-term priorities established.** Three main sections of will guide the workshop:

- I. Research Round Tables
Will gather data and prioritize research objectives; this scientific meeting will discuss its conclusions publicly by the end of the workshop (economics, population, migration, infrastructure, housing stock, legal environment, finance). The research table-clearing house would promote mixed teams to develop grants and further research.
- II. Public Evening Lecture Series
Will showcase incoming contributors and successful initiatives and case studies.
- III. Design Laboratories
Professionals, faculty and students from UF, Polytechnic and international institutions from Europe and Latin America will participate in the visioning process. The Labs will convene interdisciplinary expertise into integrated proposals. Stakeholders and public officials will be invited to actively participate. The Workshop results will be presented publicly for discussion.

1. Research Questions

- Can we collectively identify the most important issues and collect and document research data to formulate new ideas?
- Can we leverage the experience from the past and contributions from other successful cases to help focus the proposals?
- Can we assemble the existing data from different sources to be used jointly to formulate ideas and advance projects for the resiliency of the Caribbean Islands?
- How do we best address issues under an intersectoral and futuristic framework?

2. Outcomes

- Enrich existing research data banks on status quo and damage following disasters in 2017 (various sources such as Centro for Puerto Rican Studies – Data Hub that continues to be updated)
- Hierarchical identification of intersectoral research subjects to be pursued
- Consolidation of academic research alliances and collaborations for response
- Visualization of future scenarios and project bank to generate public and academic awareness

3. Topics of Research and Project Outline

The design lab topics will be developed collectively.

A synthetic outline of research topics and proposals will be developed by UF + PUPR that concerns of long term strategies beyond the disaster recovery, under the umbrella of resilient infrastructure, settlement patterns, environmental, economic and human sustainability. Multiple agents, professionals and researchers share the expressed need regarding long term re thinking before acting.

The Directors have developed an estimated budget to cover the displacement, and in loco hospitality of visiting students and professors. We anticipate the participation of many overseas members as Hunter College, UNESCO, University of La Sapienza in Rome, Escola da Cidade in Brazil, ISAD Instituto Superior De Arquitectura Y Diseño en Chihuahua, University of Chieti- Pescara,, University of California Berkeley, as well as students and professionals from Europe and South America. Though the obtained institutional support from UF + PUPR would make the workshop basic operations possible, the best outcome would rely on the expertise of international collaboration and the participation of international students that has obtained external funding.

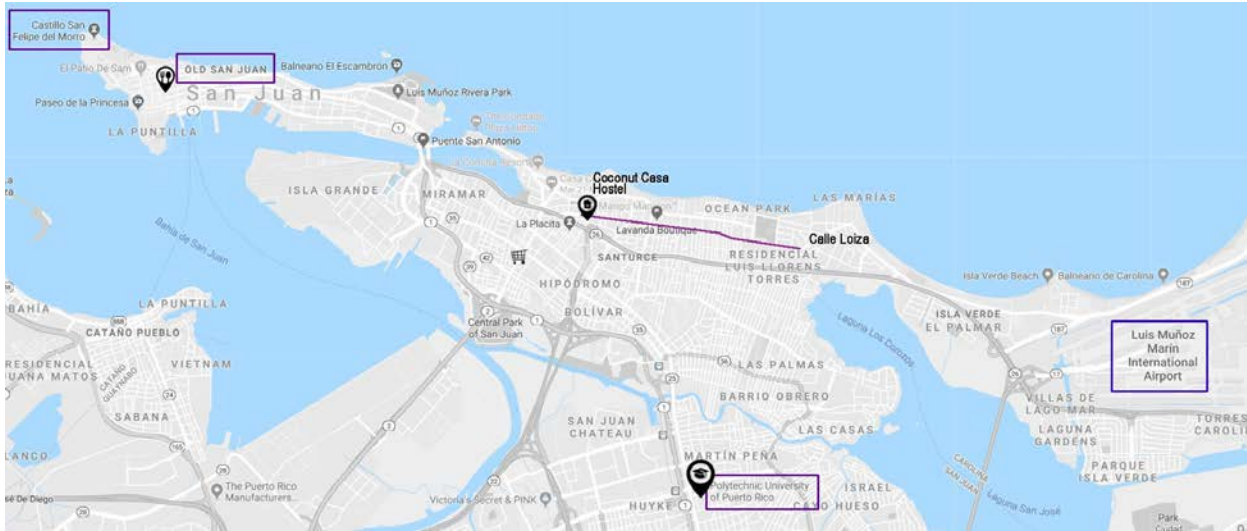

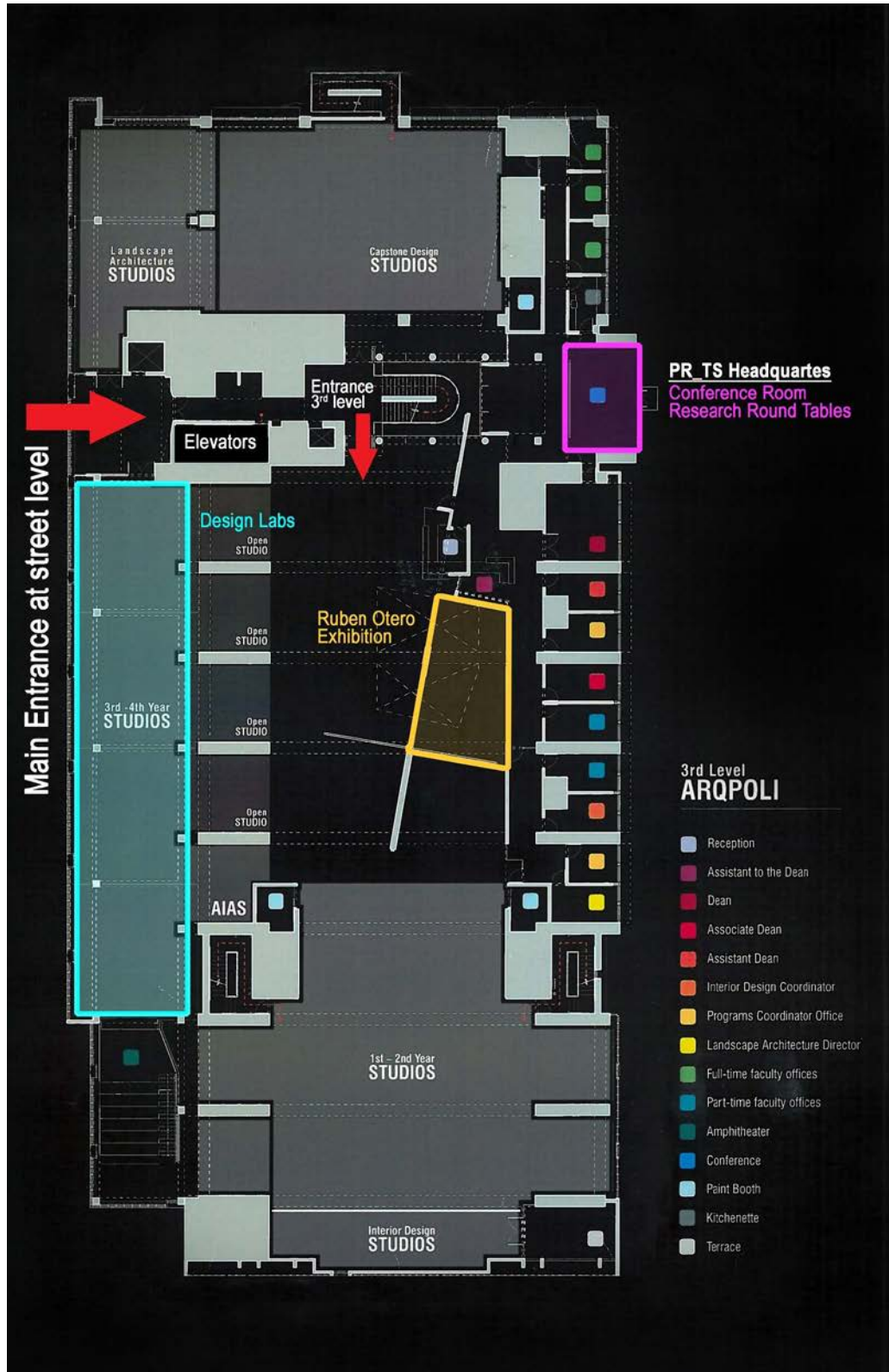

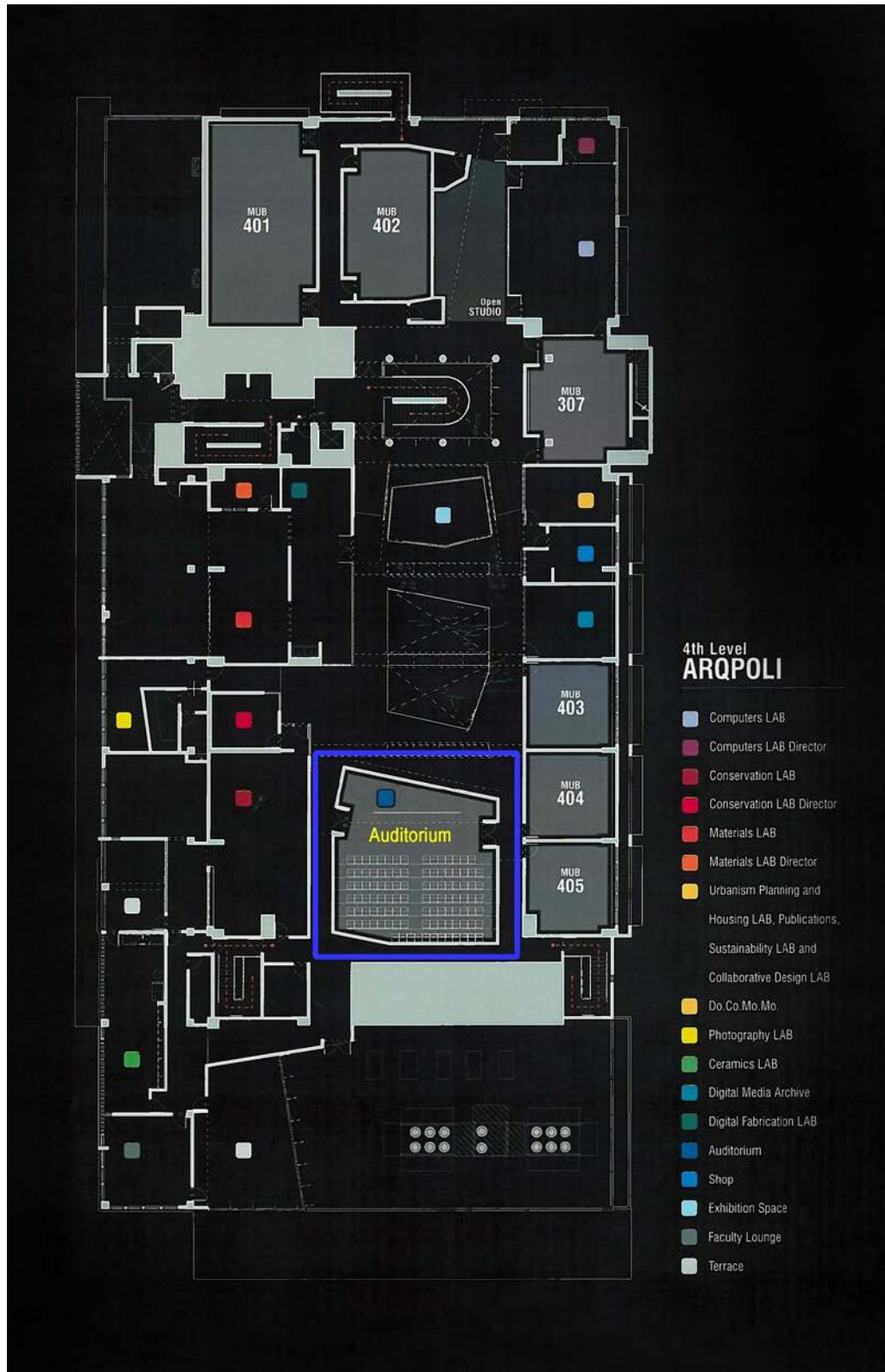
